The impact of COVID-19 on Turkey and Robert College (RC): All schools in Turkey moved to distance learning in March 2020, and during the 2020-2021 school year were only able to bring students in for short durations of hybrid learning. Despite these unprecedented limitations, RC was able to successfully deliver its full academic program. As of September 2021, all students have now returned to RC for in-person learning.

The School

Founded in 1863, Robert College is a private secondary school operated under the jurisdiction of the Turkish Ministry of Education and accredited by the New York State Association of Independent Schools. A coeducational, day and residential, university preparatory school, Robert College is located in Istanbul, on a sixty-five acre wooded area overlooking the Bosphorus strait.

Statement of Purpose

RC seeks to graduate young men and women with the skills, insights, and determination to function as leaders and contributing citizens in a wide range of social and cultural roles, both locally and internationally. For over 150 years, RC is proud to have graduated prime ministers, Olympians, notable academicians and a nobel laureate among many others successful in their respective fields.

Students

RC serves primarily Turkish students admitted solely on the basis of a highly competitive national exam; there are no legacy, sibling or transfer student contingencies. Seniors were admitted from within the top 0.01- 0.27% of approximately one million test takers. Thus, the academic ability of the student body of 1,042 is extraordinary. Unlike most international schools, the composition of the student body remains stable. Virtually all students who enter will graduate.

RC, home to many ethnic identities, enrolls day and residential students, the latter comprising 18% of the student body. The student body population is just over 1000. Though the school population is Turkish, the availability of residence halls creates significant geographic diversity and the generous financial aid program enables socio-economic diversity. Approximately 26% of the students receive financial aid to attend RC, totaling \$3.9 million this year. This is a reflection of RC's strong endowment and loyal, committed alumni.

Faculty

131 teachers, 65% of whom have a master's degree or higher, have an average of approximately 22 years teaching experience. 47% of our teachers come from 7 different countries outside Turkey. About 35% of our faculty has first language fluency in English. The student-teacher ratio is 8 to 1.

Academic Policy

Robert College **does not report student rank.** A student's grade point average (GPA) is calculated on the basis of the grade and the number of hours each class meets per week. **None of the courses including AP courses are given special weight.** The passing grade is 60 for all courses.

To earn honors a student must obtain a grade point average of 70; for high honors, 85. Robert College's academic program is very demanding. By nature of the selective exam-based entrance into RC, students are academically very strong. Admission officers are encouraged to evaluate RC students' academic success in this context.

Regardless of their previous knowledge of English, all students must complete one full year of intensive ESL instruction at RC before being promoted to the regular four year high school program. English is the language of instruction in science, mathematics, literature, physical education, arts and music; Turkish is the language of instruction in social sciences and Turkish language/literature courses. **Please see the graduation requirements chart, on the following page, for more information.** Detailed information about each academic department, including course descriptions, are under 'Academics' on our website (www.robcol.k12.tr).

Advanced Placement

The following APs are available beginning in grade 10: English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, World History: Modern, Psychology, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1: Algebra-Based, Physics C: Mechanics, Computer Science A, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, 2-D Art and Design, 3-D Art and Design, and Drawing. However, since our science curriculum is also very rigorous and demanding, taking the first two levels in each subject often covers the content found in AP courses. For this reason, many grade 10 students enter AP tests. Students who are unable to take these AP courses, or who wish to test in a subject not offered at RC, often study individually. On average, **92% of those tested in AP, score a 3 or above in at least one test.**

Community Involvement Projects (CIP)

CIP reflects the core values of RC: Responsibility, Leadership, Multiculturalism, Balance and Excellence. The program's aim is to create socially responsible citizens who see a need in the community and then act on it. Projects are student initiated and student led; RC teachers and staff serve as advisors. Every student is required to complete 75 hours of community service outside school hours. Many students go above and beyond this requirement.

Clubs

Over a hundred clubs are offered to students each year, covering a wide range of categories including arts, STEM, performance, personal skills, creativity, culture, academic learning, physical fitness, and service learning. Students in grades 9, 10 and 11 are required to enroll in a minimum of one club every year.
